# **USC Wi-Fi**:

There are two USC WiFi networks available to visitors: **USC Guest Wireless** and **Eduroam.** Both are 801.11a/b/g/n/ac at both 2.4Hz and 5.0 GHz frequencies. There is **no charge** to use either of these networks.

# **USC Guest Wireless:**

This is an <u>open network</u> with no security of any kind.

Treat "USC Guest Wireless" as you would a network at a public coffee shop!

### **Eduroam:**

Eduroam is a secure network. You must have a valid login to access this network.

Eduroam is a global wireless network access service for research and education. An eligible organization (research organization or education-related organization) can provide users (students, researchers, staff, and faculty) with wireless access at participating institutions through the use of their home institution credentials. Eduroam is available at over 12,000 locations world-wide.

If your college or university is a member of Eduroam, you can use your <u>home school's login</u> credentials to login to the Eduroam secure network at USC!

Your login username will be your university email address and your password is your university password. For example, if Tommy Trojan's USC username is **ttrojan**, his Eduroam username is **ttrojan@usc.edu**. His Eduroam password will be his USC password.


